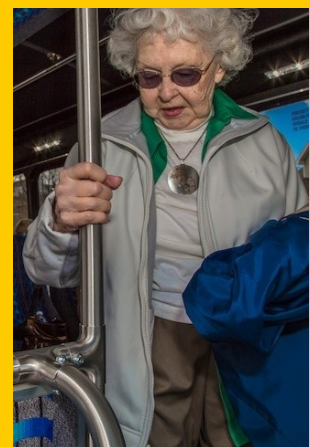

Transportation Services:

Road to Recovery is a program which utilizes volunteer drivers to take patients to their cancer treatment and back home.

Eligibility:

Patient must be ambulatory, or must bring a caregiver along to help get in and out of the vehicle. Rides through Road to Recovery are only available to cancer patients going to cancer related appointments.

Days/Hours of Service:

Rides are provided by volunteers, so it is based on availability. Please call 1-800-227-2345 as soon as an appointment is made. More advance notice is best.

Geographic Areas Covered:

Road to Recovery is available in Putnam County and surrounding areas.

Wheelchair Accessible: No

Cost: Free

Tips for Scheduling Appointments:

If a ride is needed, please call with as much advanced notice as possible.

Transportation Services:

Transportation Call Center: Will work with all callers to determine available community transportation options to meet their expressed transportation need.

FIND A RIDE Program: Transportation may be arranged for individuals who are 60 plus or who have a disability.

Eligibility:

Anyone can call for an assessment of transportation options. FIND A RIDE transportation arranged for 60 plus individuals or individuals of any age with a disability who have no other transportation options.

Days/Hours of Service:

Transportation provided at any time as long as a transportation company or volunteer is available to provide the service. Office hours are from 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Monday through Friday.

Geographic Areas Covered:

Will provide transportation and services to individuals who live in Allen, Auglaize, Hancock, Hardin, Mercer, Putnam and Van Wert counties. Will provide transportation for eligible individuals to destinations all over the state of Ohio and into Indiana.

Wheelchair Accessible: Yes

Cost: Donation Based

Other Services Offered:

Beyond Driving with Dignity Workbook: Workbook for individuals or families who are considering driving retirement or families who want to talk with a loved one about driving retirement.

Beyond Driving with Dignity Guided Self-Assessment: Guided assessment for older adults concerned about their driving safety that includes a complete driving history, cognitive exercises related to driving performance, and a ride a long with the individual in the car.

Other Services Continued:

AARP Smart Driver—Four hour classroom based course that can help you refresh your driving skills, get up to date on the rules of the road and learn research based driving strategies to you stay safe behind the wheel. There are no tests to pass and you could save on your car insurance costs.

Car Fit—An educational program that offers older adults the opportunity to check how well their personal vehicles “fit” them and gives advice on how to make their vehicle a better fit.

Transportation Services:

We provide medical and non-medical transportation for any individual in need. We can accommodate wheelchairs up to 36 inches in width and a combined weight of 600 pounds (combined weight of over 350 pounds must be in an electric wheelchair). We also accommodate individuals who can ambulate on their own.

Eligibility:

PASSPORT consumers, FIND A RIDE consumers or private pay consumers (no restrictions).

Days/Hours of Service:

Monday through Sunday. Hours vary upon schedule. We reserve scheduling on Saturday and Sundays for dialysis patients. Any other requests will only be accepted if a driver is available and is willing to cover the shift.

Geographic Areas Covered:

Allen, Auglaize, Hardin, Hancock, Putnam, Van Wert, Mercer, Shelby, Logan, Miami, Champaign, Clark and Preble counties.

Wheelchair Accessible: Yes

Cost: Private Pay: \$89.00 base rate for round trip plus \$2.00 per mile after 5 miles. Charge of \$1.00 per empty mile to clients over 10 miles outside of Lima, Ohio.

Tips for Scheduling Appointments:

Call at least 2-3 days ahead of time. This is not a restriction if it will fit into our schedule. We accept appointments called in on the same day. Have as much information about your destination as possible. The doctor's name, address, suite numbers and phone numbers are very helpful.

In-home senior care including incidental transportation for shopping, errands and doctor appointments.

Eligibility:

Seniors and others. Must be 18 years old.

Days/Hours of Service:

24 hours per day, 7 days per week

Geographic Areas Covered:

Putnam, Hancock, Wood, Wyandot, and Seneca Counties.

Cost:

\$20.50 per hour with three hour minimum and regularly scheduled. \$25.00 per hour for temporary or irregular schedule with a minimum of a \$100 charge.

Calls are answered 24 hours per day, 7 days per week. A client assessment is required.

Eligibility: Putnam County cancer patients.

Monday through Friday from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

Geographic Areas Covered: Putnam County

Wheelchair Accessible: No

Cost: Free. There are no income guidelines.

Brief description of Other Services Offered:

The Putnam County Cancer Assistance Program was established to reduce some of the financial burden of cancer treatments by providing reimbursement for the following:

- * Prescription expenses related to treatment, including chemotherapy, radiation and other cancer related medications not covered by insurance.
- * Mileage to and from treatments and mileage for testing related to cancer.
- * Financial assistance for supplies associated with having cancer, such as nutritional supplements, wigs and medical supplies.

Additional Information:

The Putnam County Cancer Assistance Program is a non-profit service that is funded through donations, memorials, the United Way of Putnam County and an annual auction benefit. The cancer auction is held the weekend before Easter, every year.

Transportation Services:

Transportation services are available to Putnam County residents, age 60 and better, for medical appointments and for personal business. Medical transports are available anywhere within Putnam County and to the adjacent counties of Allen, Defiance, Hancock, Henry, Paulding and Van Wert. Transportation for personal business is available within Putnam County and includes trips to social service agencies, beauty salons, pharmacies, grocery stores, banks and other essential errands. Transportation is provided in wheelchair accessible vans and agency cars by professionally trained and caring personnel. Advanced notice is required for transportation services.

Eligibility: Putnam County resident age 60 and better.

Days/Hours of Service: Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

Geographic Areas Covered:

Allen, Defiance, Hancock, Henry, Paulding, Putnam and Van Wert counties for medical appointments. Within Putnam County for personal business and essential errands.

Wheelchair Accessible: Yes

Cost: All services are free and offered regardless of income. Donations are graciously accepted. A suggested donation list may be obtained by calling the Council on Aging office.

Tips for Scheduling Appointments:

1. Please contact the Council on Aging as soon as you receive your doctor's appointment.
2. Please have your doctor's address available when you call to schedule your transport.
3. When calling in your transport, please let us know of any special needs you may have such as: using a walker or wheelchair, oxygen, family member riding along, etc.
4. If you cancel your doctor's appointment, please remember to call the Council on Aging to cancel your transport.
5. When the driver arrives at your home, please allow them to escort you. Please understand that this is our agency policy.
6. Please be ready to leave at your estimated pick-up time. Please be aware that weather (fog, snow, heavy rain, etc.) may be a factor that could affect your pick-up time.
7. If you have pets in the home, please make sure they are secured before the driver arrives.
8. Please consider our office hours of 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Monday through Friday, when scheduling your appointments.
9. Please be aware that we do not allow food and drinks in our vehicles.
10. If you have any additional stops to make on the day of your appointment, please call them into the office ahead of time so we can allow enough time for those stops.

Tips for Scheduling Transportation Continued:

11. During the winter months, please keep your sidewalk and driveway clear of ice and snow. Please make arrangements to have a family member, friend or neighbor clear a path wide enough for two people to walk side by side from your door to the vehicle. Our number one priority is your safety.

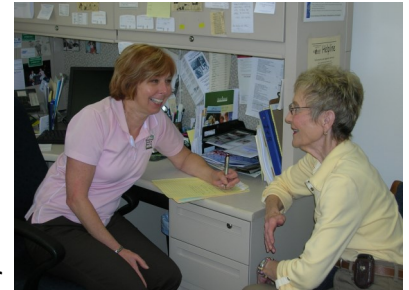
Brief Description of Other Services Offered:

Chore Services: The chore program helps older adults remain safe and secure in their homes by providing assistance with seasonal needs, minor home repairs, home maintenance and other tasks which older adults are no longer able to perform. Examples include: rake leaves, wash windows, trim shrubs, clean spouts and eaves, install grab bars and handrails and so much more.

A Matter of Balance (MOB): The MOB program is an award-winning program designed to help older adults manage falls and increase activity levels. The program is a free, eight week program. It is held once a week for eight consecutive weeks. Each session is two hours. The MOB participants will learn to view falls as something they can control, set goals and increase activity levels, make changes to reduce fall risks at home and exercise to increase strength and balance.

Outreach and Information and Referral: Navigating community resources can be confusing at any age. An Outreach Specialist is available to provide personalized help to link older adults, their loved ones and their caregivers to community resources in order to maintain their independence.

Telephone Reassurance: To ensure the continued well-being of older adults who are isolated or homebound, our staff provide a regular daily telephone call to provide companionship, conversation and a check on their well-being. If a problem occurs at the senior's home, a pre-arranged plan of action is initiated.



Additional Information:

The Putnam County Council on Aging, Inc. is a non-profit organization established in 1978. The agencies mission is to provide services to Putnam County residents, age 60 and better, to enable them to remain independent in their own home for as long as possible. All services are free and offered regardless of income. The Council on Aging is an United Way of Putnam County Partner Agency.

Transportation Services:

The Putnam County Office of Public Safety (PCOPS) will transport clients by wheelchair or car to doctor appointments, hospital testing, procedures and /or for admission. We can transport to get groceries or for pet care. We can take clients to funerals and weddings. We can transport for court appearances.

Eligibility:

The PCOPS will transport anyone. Payers of Source are Private Pay, Insurance, and/or Medicaid.

Days/Hours of Service:

Monday through Friday early morning to later in the evening. The PCOPS can transport on weekends and holidays upon request, if drivers are available.

Geographic Areas Covered:

Putnam, Henry, Allen, Hancock, Van Wert. The PCOPS can also transport to Cincinnati, Cleveland, Columbus, Fort Wayne and Toledo. The office tries not to go out of state for transports.

Wheelchair Accessible: Yes

Cost:

\$30.00 basic charge plus \$1.00 per mile.

Tips for Scheduling Appointments:

Please call as soon as you know you need transportation.

We can transport groups of people for evacuation during floods.

Transportation Services:

Transportation Assistance: The Putnam County Veteran Services Commission now has two veterans that volunteer to transport all veterans to and from scheduled appointments to VA Medical Centers. Individuals interested in using this service need to call the Putnam County Veterans Service Commission to schedule a ride.

Compensation for Travel: Veterans of Putnam County will also receive compensation if they choose to drive themselves to their scheduled appointments to VA Medical Centers. Individuals using this service will need to bring in a mileage report into the office and will be reimbursed for each mile driven. Please call or come into the office for further information.

Eligibility:

Any veteran of Putnam County who was discharged Honorably, General Under Honorable Conditions, and Other than Honorable Conditions (Service Connected and Case by Case Basis).
